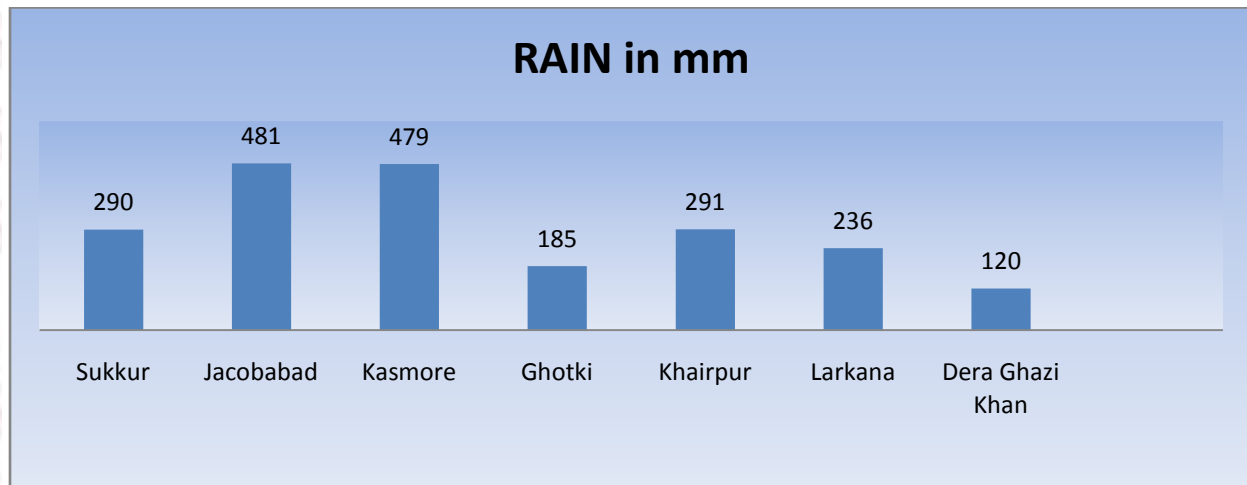
SITUATION

Heavy monsoon rains in Pakistan have submerged houses, destroyed crops and displaced thousands of families in Sindh Panjab and Balochistan. At least 158 people died and dozens were injured as torrential rains and flash floods wreaked havoc in Pakistan. Most of them due to roof collapses, during rains on 11/09/2012 and 12/2012 The rains also left thousands homeless, destroyed crops and property worth millions of rupees.

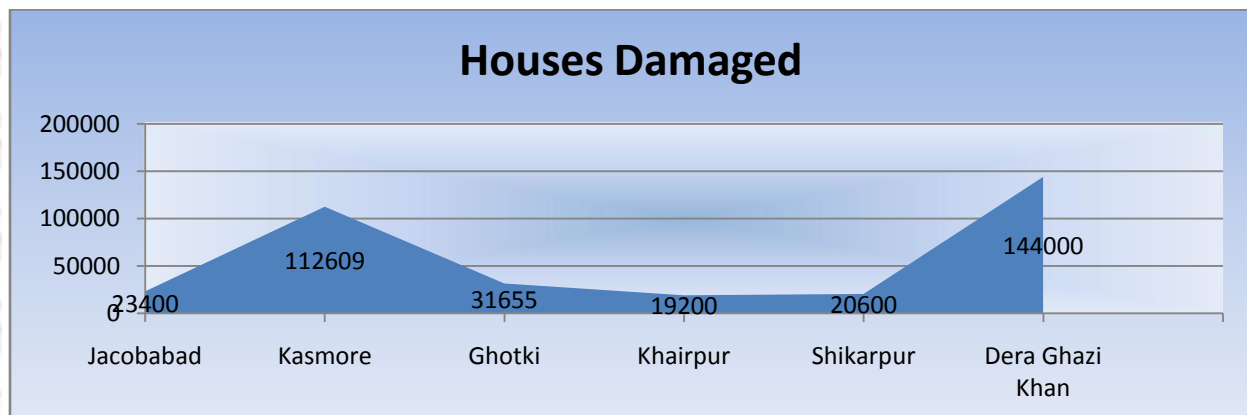
The provincial government has declared an emergency in Jacobabad, Khairpur,

Kashmore districts which have been badly affected by the rains. Hundreds of people have been displaced so far, Jacobbad and Dera Ghazi Khan were worst affected areas in Sindh and Punjab respectively where rain water played havoc.

Army was also been sought in Kandhkot area of Sindh where the forces had launched rescue operation to assist civil administration.

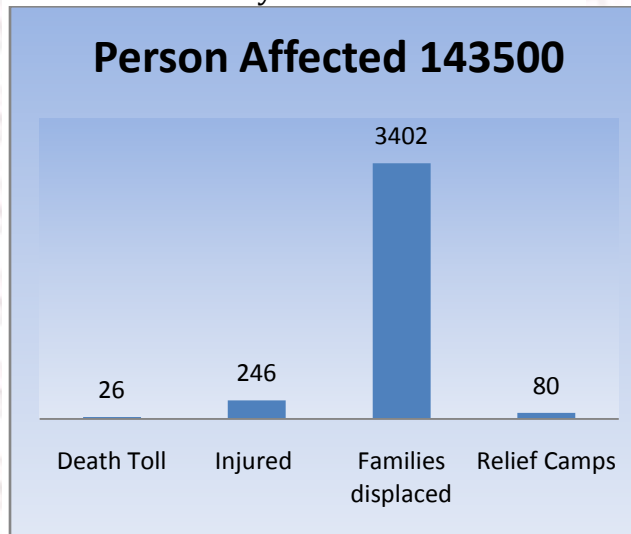

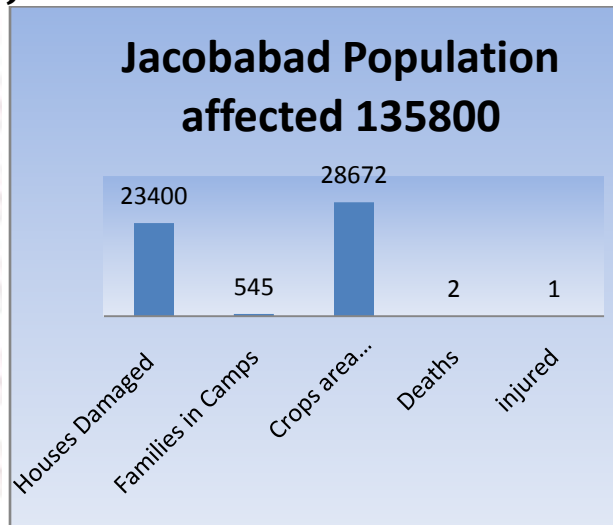
SHIKARPUR

Shikarpur after two weeks of serious emergency situation 1024 houses collapsed, 26 people were killed and over 74 others injured in the rain-related incidents in the city.

Submerging several roads of the city including railways station, Ghanta Ghar and Jomani Hall under five-foot rainwater.



JACOBABAD



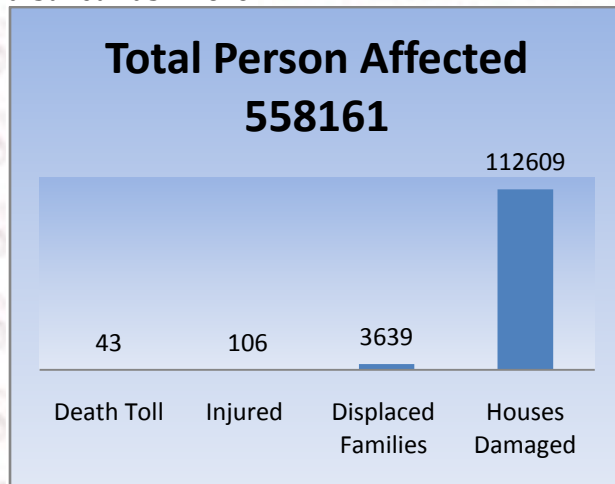
481 MM rain was recorded beating record of last 100 years, it was due to heavy rains last which has impeded the life of city roads and streets lanes are filled with the water, in the result of heavy rains 23400 houses were damaged, 135800

population is displaced, according to PDMA 548 families are shifted to relief Camps, 1 case of Snake bite is reported in the district. Many villages are under the water, and villagers are in open sky.

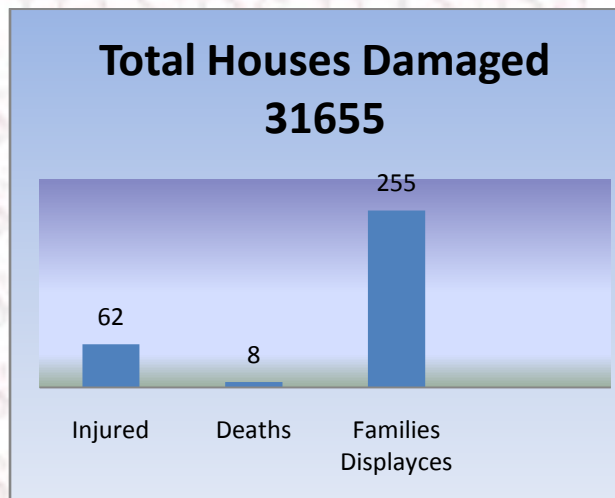
KASHMORE

Widespread rains played havoc; 43 deaths in collapse incidents. **106** people sustained injuries according to (Media) reports. Livestock also suffered and many animals died due to rain. Water level which has been calculated **479** mm in district Kashmore.

The communication systems was totally damaged electricity system was also disrupted for first Five days. Many people were displaced due to heavy rain, they have got shelter under some government schools, BHUs, RHCs. Some are still sitting on roads or high places under open sky.



GHOTKI



31655 houses have severely been damaged reported by Govt Officials, **97408** Acres of Peddy and Sugar cane Crops are under water on large scale. Police Station Khambhara has been totally

collapsed. Hundreds of families have been displaced. Rapid Assessment teams have assisted immediate need of Medical Support, Tents, NFIs and Food items in the area to support the deprived families.

DERA GHAZI KHAN (PANJAB)

In Dera Ghazi Khan Many of villages have been badly damaged whereas hundreds of houses have been partially and completely damaged. The total magnitude of flood was **144,000** Cusecs were recorded according to district government. The local government declared the state of emergency in Dera Ghazi Khan. This breach in DG canal due to torrential water has severely damaged the residential areas which were near the

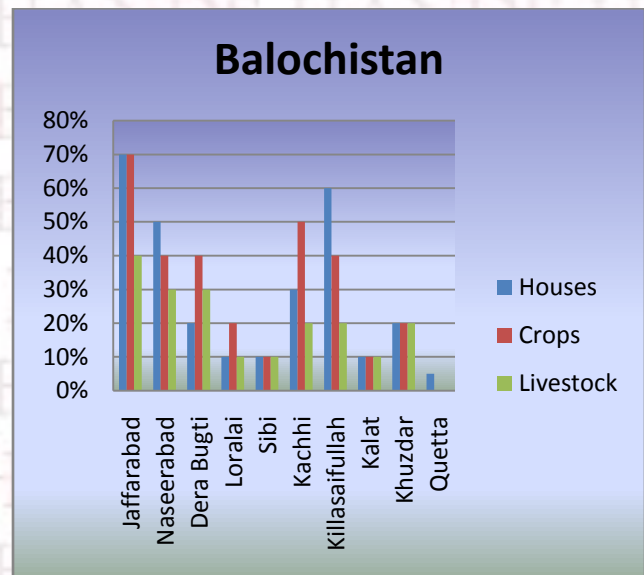
DG canal and also hit the deep areas of city very badly in which mainly poor and marginalized communities were settled. According to recent figers **1760** houses are damaged and most of the people near the city were immediately shifted to railway station platform leaving everything behind. There affected people are looking for help from government and humanitarian actors.



JAFFERABAD (BALOCHISTAN)

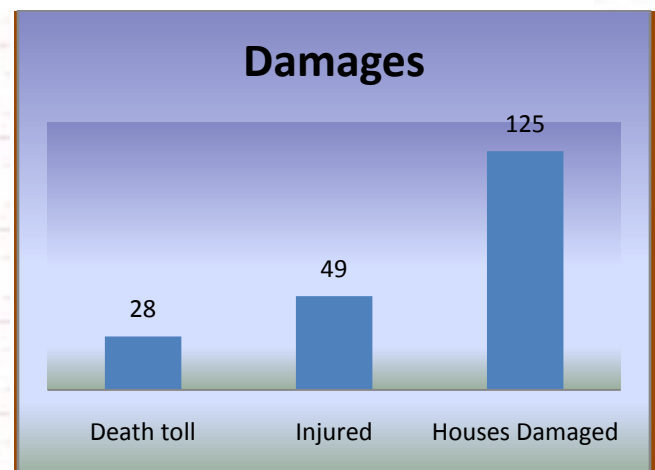
Situation in Jaffarabad and Naseerabad Districts of Balochistan is worse, 11 Districts are still facing heavy rains. Due to flood/rains people are facing road blockages. it is expected that till tomorrow emergency may be announced. Govt agencies through FC and Army supporting affected population through

their own resources as per media reports. Yester day PDMA called a meeting and PDMA failed to declare emergency and announce effected districts as disaster hit area. NGOs and Donor organizations were ready for support but they are still waiting for the Emergency declaration.



NASEERABAD

Rain/flood water entered in the district from Dera Bugti and Sibi Districts and destroyed hundreds of villages due to breaches in Rabi canal and Pat feeder canal, till date 28 dead bodies recovered from flood water and more dead bodies found in running water but could not catch by people. People from Jaffarabad and villages of DM Jamal Naseerabad have taken shelter in Govt buildings, and round side under trees. Armed forces has approached the district and providing relief services in the area.



HANDS RESPONSE

HANDS is one of the largest not for profit organization of country and having strong roots and work in all districts of Sindh & Balochistan and Panjab. HANDS has more than 2000 staff and about 13,000 volunteers available and mobilizing all

Rescue/Evacuation

HANDS has started rescue and evacuation operation in Thull district Jacobabad by

within couple of days HANDS has extensive experience of Emergency Response and implementing relief activities with coordination of district governments, UN, & other Humanitarian Agencies & civil society organizations.

utilizing Boats and small trucks. HANDS is evacuating 80 individuals on daily basis.



FOOD SUPPLIES

HANDS has started sharing of cooked food in affected people of Two districts Shikarpur and Jacobabad, uncooked food is provided to 5000 peoples on daily basis. HANDS is also providing one month Dry Food family package to 600 families with the collaboration of DFID.



WATER AND SANITATION HYGIENE (WASH)

For safe drinking water, Water Treatment units are installed in Ranjhan pur and Jacobabad. 7000 families are provided safe drinking water on daily basis. HANDS teams are also providing water in camps

through water water tankers, HANDS has also installed dewatering machines in Jacobabad, Kashmore, Shikarpur and Ghotki.



MEDICAL CAMPS

HANDS has treated just about 2862 OPD patients through Mobile Medical Camps for the Rain/flood affected people in order to make available the medical

services to the sick, and injured including preventive vaccination for different viral, fungal, bacterial and other diseases.
